

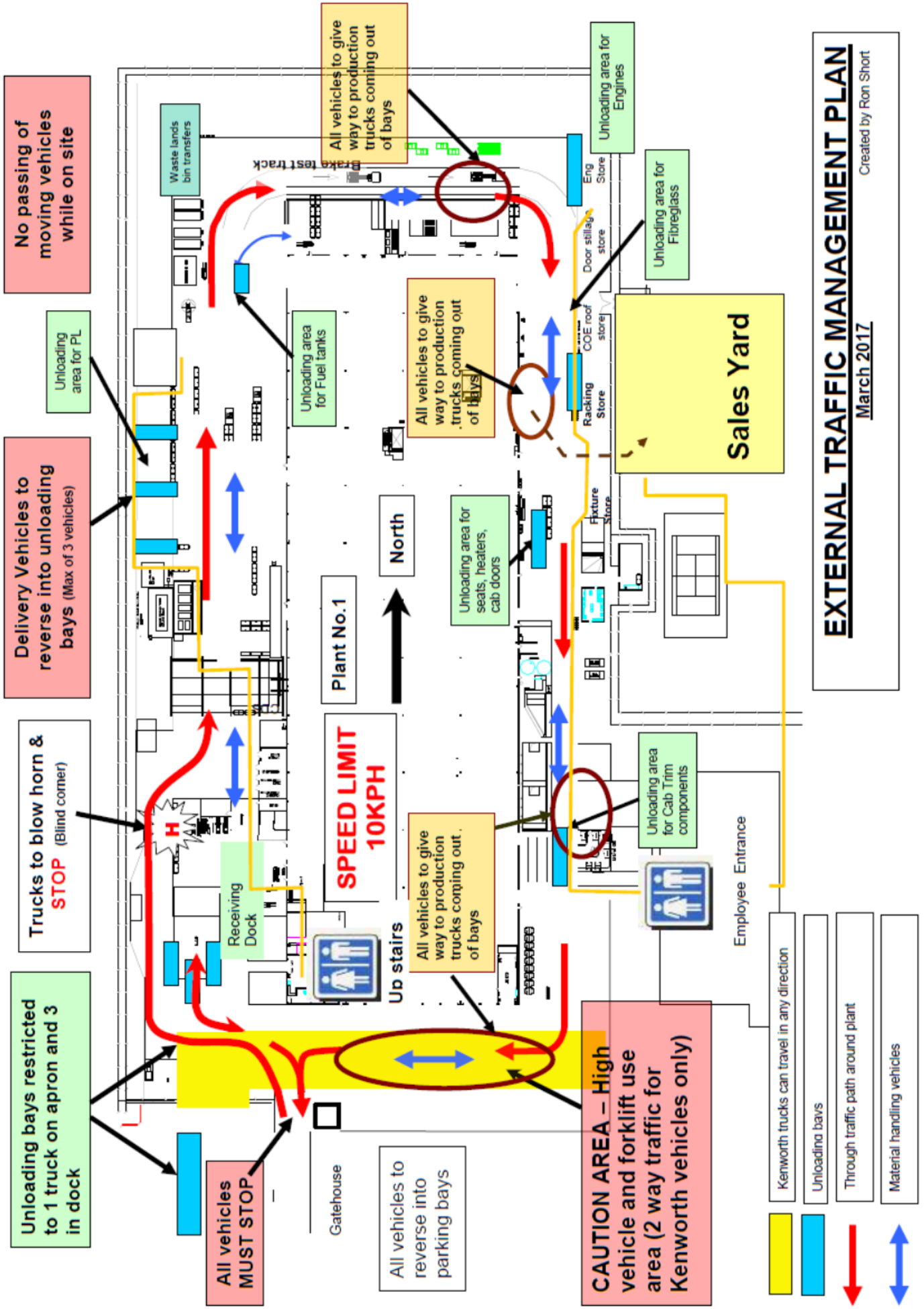
Kenworth Trucks Site Traffic Rules for Delivery and Service Contractor Drivers

These set of rules, directed towards delivery and service contractors entering the site with vehicles, forms part of Kenworth Trucks Traffic Management System. It can be used to assist suppliers with training of drivers about the Kenworth site or to inform courier and contractor drivers of their responsibilities when driving through the Kenworth site. This, together with the site map, should provide sufficient information to ensure a safe visit to the Kenworth site.

- The speed limit around the outside of the main production plant is 10 kmph
- Drivers must wait in line at the gatehouse until the guard waves you through; Guard will be recording your registration number, company and time of entry.
- Vehicles must Give Way to pedestrians on designated walkways and at yellow zebra crossings. In all other areas pedestrians should give way to vehicles, but everyone needs to be alert at all times.
- Vehicles must not drive on or park over the pedestrian walkways
- Vehicles are not allowed to over-take another moving vehicle while driving around the outside of the Plant. No overtaking or driving beside other moving trucks or material handling vehicles. Overtaking is acceptable only when vehicles pull off the main driveway or stop.
- Vehicles are to stop and blow horn before proceeding past the North-West corner of the receiving dock. Blind spot and high material handling vehicle area.
- Delivery and contractor vehicles must give way to Kenworth Production trucks exiting the plant's work bays. Be on constant alert.
- Once a delivery vehicle has passed the receiving dock bays, it must observe a clockwise, "One Way" direction of travel around the plant.
- Delivery vehicles must park in designated unloading bays as directed by the guard or material handler.
- Drivers must be wearing Hi-Vis vest or clothing while preparing their vehicle for loading / unloading.
- Once drivers they have their vehicle ready, they are to stay in the cab or go to a driver's safety zone or walkway. Drivers are not to be on the vehicle to assist with the loading / unloading of their vehicle.
- Drivers must not use a mobile phone while driving on site.
- Drivers are not allowed to smoke on site.
- Report any incident that involves a vehicle immediately to supervisors or guard. This may include injury to personnel or damage to another vehicle, racking or plant. An Incident Report must be done.

Kenworth have an obligation maintain a safe place of work for our visitors, contractors and employees on the site at all times. Non-conformances to the above traffic rules will force Kenworth to conduct an investigation, and possibly, end with a refusal of entry to the driver.
